

CCSF updated Global Outreach info

In October of 2015, Global Outreach's executive director, Tom Wright led a medical and dental team to work in Igegu village, Tanzania. At that time, pastor Michael Chacha had 37 members in his Bible study and the village people drank water from the same pond where the livestock watered.

Since then, the village chief donated a tract of land, a church has been built and a rainwater catchment and filter installed and the church has grown to 121 members. Tom is quick to point out this progress is not due to the medical team's visit, but it is as a result of the Spirit led staff of the African Key Men who specialize in church planting among unreached people groups, emphasizing the principals of reproductive discipleship. They are selected from local Christian leaders who can communicate easily within their culture.



Each Key Man has completed two years of leadership training and is equipped with solar powered projector and a motorbike. Collectively, they have shown evangelistic videos to over two million adults and educated 2.2 million students in HIV/AIDS in East Africa and disciplined over eleven hundred Christian village leaders and pastors.

Funding for Global Outreach has helped equip the Key Man staff. It has provided for the completion of thirty-four new church buildings in the past eighteen months, paid for pre- and postnatal vitamins to women living in remote areas of Honduras and funded small businesses for widows and abused women in Cameroon.
