• Welcome! We're glad you're here! Whether you're investigating the Christian faith, looking for a church home, or have been with us for a long time, all are welcome. We are a church that loves this city of Santa Fe and are grateful for the Gospel (Good News) of Jesus and His mercy toward imperfect people like us. The love of God be with you all!.

• First time visitors: Stop at the front desk to pick up a special gift!

• Worship space: We ask that you please enter the Sanctuary quietly as our worship provides a time of peaceful reflection for all. Please silence your cell phones.

• Listening: <u>Hearing assistance</u> - LISTEN EVERYWHERE is up and running! Instructions available at the tech booth in the back of the WAC, or at the sanctuary doors. <u>Live broadcast</u> of the service is available in the Chapel Atrium. <u>Audio-only broadcast</u> and additional seating is available in the Plaza or the Ascension Chapel.

• Nursery: A nursery is available for newborns to age 4. The nursery is free and staffed by a certified caregiver overseeing volunteers. A preschool lesson is taught by adult volunteers during the service. The Ascension Chapel may be used for a cry room if needed.

- We will have four communion stations; the *middle* aisle has *both* regular and gluten-free bread.
- The outer ring of cups contains juice (light) and the remainder contain wine (dark)
- If you have any <u>prayer needs</u>, there are prayer team members standing in the back, available to pray with you.
- All baptized Christians are invited to partake at the Lord's table

* Note to Parents: Can my child take communion? We believe that once your child is baptized and you discern they have professed their faith in Christ in an age appropriate way, it is good for them to take communion. Jesus said, "welcome the little children," and so we welcome yours to the Lord's table. If you have any questions about your child's profession of faith, Greg and John would love to meet with you.

Do you need to receive communion at your seat? Please raise your hand and our servers will be happy to accommodate your needs.

Diaspora Communion is available for all members of CCSF and immediate family who would like to take Communion but are unable to be present at Sunday Worship. The consecrated elements from Sunday will be brought to you at your home, or hospital and a brief Communion Service will take place. 2. What upsets the scribes? From their Old Testament perspective, why is it upsetting? What does this teach us about how Jesus understood himself?

3. What is Jesus' bold and challenging response to the scribes? How does he both affirm their accusation and also show them the deeper problem he came to address?

4. Why does he refer to himself as the Son of Man? How does this title require us to grapple with God's promises for his people in the Old Testament?

5. Why does Matthew tell us the crowds were afraid? How should their awe and reference inform how we worship Jesus and his gospel?
