Some information about this Lessons and Carols service:

The first Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was held at King's College, Cambridge on Christmas Eve 1918. It was planned by Rev. Eric Milner-White, who had just been appointed Dean of Chapel after serving in the British Army during WWI as a chaplain. His purpose in creating the service was to develop a "more imaginative" worship service than the traditional Evensong service. This service was adapted from an order created by E.W. Benson for use at 10pm on Christmas Eve in 1880 and was first broadcast in the UK in 1928. With the exception of 1930, it has been broadcast annually to millions, even during the period of WWII when the glass had been removed from the King's College Chapel during the period of intense German bombing.

For more than a century, worshippers have gathered for this service to take in the scope of the coming of Jesus Christ in Scripture and song, remembering as voices are raised, as the Word is read, and as candles are lit in the darkness that God is faithful to a promise to send a Savior to We carry on that tradition here at Christ Church Santa Fe every Christmas Eve, remembering together that Jesus Christ is "the light of the world" and that "whoever follows [Him] will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (Jn. 8:12)


